

# How Washington state compares to US


Real GDP: Percent Change at Annual Rate, 2020:Q2–2020:Q3



### The economic impact of COVID-19 is unprecedented

Employment declines greater than the deepest point of the Great Recession

### Significant uncertainty around near-term recovery


Alarming disease trajectory during winter; new fed support on the way; awaiting news on additional state support



Only includes regular program claims (No PUA, PEUC, or Shared Work)





Viewing 3 months ending November 2020




% change in taxable business income from same period last year

#### WA export volume by commodity category






#### Investments in Washington businesses by quarter


